	CD: We think that ah every consumer products should comply with regulations that are created by EPA and FDA.
	JW: But under current law that is not part of the regulations, do you think that they should disclosed carcinogens or endocrine disruptor on a label.
	CD: We have EPA and FDA and industry as well as consumers should rely on those regulatory agencies to make those determinations and what's the appropriate information that should be disclosed.

	CD: Well it's not, the issue is complex and needs to be dealt with a science basis // if a product doesn't have an exposure of any type of

chemical that may pose a health concern which is being determined by FDA and EPA then it shouldn't be required to be labeled which is what congress and policy makers determined.

JW: Don't you think a parent has a right to know that there is a carcinogen in a product that they are buying for a baby?

CD: the ahthe hearing that we are having today is basically trying to modernize and reform the laws so the regulatory agencies are doing a better job

JW: But that doesn't force the disclosure of carcinogens - people might want to know there's a carcinogen in a product they are buying?

CD: And that's where congress has that authority

JW: Well what do you think personally, would you want know if there is a carcinogen in a product you're buying?

CD: we want to have the appropriate information that is disclosed that pose unreasonable risk to human health and the environment.

JW: I like to separate the safety and the transparency issue - people have a right to know - risk can be subjective but whether you're transparent that's binary - you're either disclosing or you're not. Why wouldn't you want people to know there's a carcinogen in product they're buying?

CD: I think that, You know we, you know we have to place a great deal of confidence with our regulatory agencies Food and Drug Administration...

JW: How can we trust them if they don't even have the information?
CD: Oh they
JW: The FDA is not legally obligated to ask a company it regulates for a list of chemicals in their own products.
CD: FDA has information about every chemical that is in a consumer product
JW: No they don't
CD: Sure they do.
JW: They do not. What about the fragrance loophole?
CD: I'm not - I don't represent them
JW: They say it's a trade secret so they don't have to disclose carcinogens and EDC'S
CD: Even on a trade secret they have the information
